USS MIDWAY TOUR

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 16TH, 2019

The USS Midway was commissioned in August 1945 and was the largest carrier in the world until 1955. It was the first Aircraft Carrier that large to pass through the Panama Canal. The Midway operated in the fleet for 47 years, seeing duty in Vietnam and Operation Desert Storm before being decommissioned in 1992. The Midway was named to commentate the battle of Midway in WWII, and is now a museum in San Diego, CA. The ship has several Naval aircraft on the flight deck that operated off the Midway during its nearly half century of service.



During our tour of the ship you may see the ship from the engine room to the Admirals Bridge. You will have the opportunity to experience the enormity and complexity of a United States Navy Aircraft Carrier.

We will meet at the Ticket Booth at the USS Midway **by 9:50 AM** on Saturday, the 16th of November. You can buy tickets in advance at a discount on the Midway website—www.midway.org. Prices are: \$22 Adults; \$19 Seniors (62+); \$9 Retired Military and Spouses. Online tickets are valid for one year from date of purchase. Otherwise, add one dollar if purchased at the Midway Ticket Booth.

Parking is \$10.00 at the Midway Pier, and is good all day. We'll tour the Midway at our leisure, and can use Audio Guides which are available at reception desk. We'll tour from 10:00 AM until **12:00PM**. Afterwards, we have Reservations at 12:30 PM at **The Fish Market** for lunch where you may order off the menu individually with an 18% gratuity. Lunch is limited to the first 25 people who RSVP to Rudy.





DID YOU KNOW?



All the Radio Equipment is Carried, without Crowding, in Odd Corners of the Automobile, the Antenna Masts and Wires being Folded under the Running Board When Not in Use

Note the radio may be used to hear sermons. The radio was considered by some be to be an instrument of the devil.

The first European car radio made its appearance in 1933. It was called an Audiosuper 5 and was developed by Band, carried the blue dot (Blauer Punkt) and was developed by Bosch in Stuttgart Germany. Blaupunkt would become the company until 2009. This radio weighed in the 50 lb. range.
